39th Professorial Inaugural Lecture: Physical Activity A Panacea to Life Threatening Diseases

Life threatening diseases are now taking over as a result of physical inactivity and a sedentary lifestyle a Professor of Physical and Health Education, Prof. Danladi Ibrahim Musa, has said.

Professor Danladi Ibrahim Musa, who delivered the 39th Professorial Inaugural Lecture, titled **Waging War on the Deadly Quartet and its Co- morbidities: A Physical Activity Panacea** on Thursday, 25th April, 2019, at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, said that the society today was at war against the ominous enemy, metabolic syndrome, and other chronic diseases, which conferred a heavy burden to the populace in terms of medical costs and human sufferings.

He added that physical activities had proven to be potentially effective components of our arsenal in the war against metabolic syndrome. Regrettably, he said physical activity intervention appeared to be the least used weapon in the war against diseases.

According to the University don, it was established that a good number of adults and youths were affected by metabolic syndrome, which could be treated with medication, though he strongly recommended that lifestyle modifications, such as behavioral, dietary and physical activity components, should be the first line of approach, “evidence existed that regular exercise

mitigated cardio–metabolic risk independent of dietary intervention,” he said.

Professor Musa explained that physical activity intervention in the form of an exercise training program had been shown to reduce individual heart disease risk factors, such as high blood pressure, high plasma lipid and lipoproteins, high blood glucose and reduced cholesterol amongst others.

According to him physical activities guidelines recommended moderate – intensity of a daily minimum of 30 – 60 minutes of brisk walking complemented by other activities, such as gardening, household work, jogging, biking, golfing and swimming, among others.

In his opening remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor M. Y. Bello, who was represented by the DVC (Academics), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, thanked and welcomed all those present and expressed happiness that the inaugural lecture had become so popular that the queue had become so long that Professors were now jostling for space to deliver their inaugural lectures. He, therefore, expressed his appreciation to the Chairperson of the Inaugural Lecture Committee, Professor Tinuade Oyeyi, and her team for their tireless efforts in always making the inaugural lectures a success.

BUK Competitively Chosen for PASET's PhD Programmes Validation

Bayero University, Kano was competitively chosen for validation of the Partnership for Skills in Applied Sciences, Engineering and Technology (PASET's) Pan African Regional Scholarship and Innovation Fund (RSIF) PhD programmes, said a validation team leader, Dr Moses Osiru, while briefing the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello of the team's mission in BUK on 18th April, 2019.

Dr. Osiru, who is the Manager, RSIF Regional Coordination Unit, told the Vice Chancellor that Centre for Dryland Agriculture's supported PhD programmes in Natural Resource Management and Climate Change had passed through rigorous technical evaluation process involving review by three independent technical reviewers. He said their visit was to make an onsite validation. "If Bayero University scales through this validation, it will be selected as one of the universities to host PASET PhD programmes," he added.

Dr Osiru added that BUK's proposal was one of the 15 proposals selected for on-site evaluation. He said 144 proposals were received, 80 qualified for desk review, out of the 80 the best 3 in each of the 5 thematic areas of PASET were selected for on-site evaluation.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Haruna Wakili, welcomed the PASET Team to Bayero University and said the University was indeed happy to be visited for validation. He said the University has always pursued for excellence that's why it was lucky to have two academic centres of excellence, CDA and ACEPHAP.

While at the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), the Director, Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin briefed the team about the historical background of Bayero University and the evolution of the Centre, which he said started from the humble beginnings and metamorphosed to become one of the strategic academic centres of excellence in Africa with students from across West African countries.

Guidelines for Conducting Nikah/Wedding Fatiha/Marriage in Bayero University Friday Mosques

The Bayero University Mosques Management Committee (herein BUMMC) wishes to bring to the notice of members of the University community and the general public that it is introducing some guidelines for conducting weeding **Fatiha** in all the Friday Mosques under its jurisdiction. This follows some personal calls by members of the public and written memos received by the BUMMC calling for improvements on the manner in which the marriage ceremony is conducted in the University **Mosques**. The overall aim is to improve on the sacrosancy of the Wedding Fatiha, respond to the changing needs of our modern times and for **mitigating** unnecessary litigations. Specifically, the guidelines are as follows:

- Parents or guardians must obtain and fill appropriate form from the Secretariat of the BUMMC located at the Old Campus Central Mosque and return same accordingly;
- Parents or guardians of bride must give a minimum of two weeks (2) notice to the BUMMC before the proposed marriage date;
- Parents or guardians must pay a token fee of N3,000.00 only, for processing of marriage certificate and cost of other consumable items;
- Parents or guardians must present medical certificate from a certified Hospital for HIV/AIDS test of couples

for the marriage;

- e) Parents or guardians are encouraged to conduct other tests like Sickle cell and Hepatitis tests;
- f) Parents or guardians are informed that they are responsible for any damage or loss to the University or BUMMC properties **inflicted** by their invitees and their invitees must comply to the set rules for parking of vehicles and or any other rule(s) that shall be

applied/**enforced**; and

- g) Parents or guardians of the bride should note that the BUMMC is under no obligation to conduct any Wedding Fatiha or marriage in the event that the guidelines/conditions under (a-d) are not fulfilled.

These guidelines will come into effect on the month of Rabiul Auwal, 1440AH equivalent to December, 2018.

University Health Centre: Health Tips on Cerebrospinal Meningitis!!!

Cerebrospinal Meningitis (CSM) is a disease characterised by inflammation of the meninges (protective membrane covering the brain and the spinal cord) which can be caused by a variety of microbial pathogens including viral and bacterial organisms.

Transmission

Transmission is through direct person-to-person contact, including droplets from the nose and throat of infected persons. Transmission is facilitated by close and prolonged contact (such as sneezing, coughing and kissing,), smoking, overcrowding, while certain climatic conditions like dry season, where winds, cold nights, and associated upper respiratory tract infections combine to damage the lining of the nasopharynx.

Symptoms:

- ✓ Sudden high fever
- ✓ Stiff neck
- ✓ Severe headache that seems different than normal
- ✓ Headache with nausea or vomiting
- ✓ Confusion or difficulty concentrating
- ✓ Seizures

- ✓ Sleepiness or difficulty waking
- ✓ Sensitivity to light
- ✓ No appetite or thirst
- ✓ Skin rash (sometimes, such as in meningococcal meningitis)

Prevention:

Personal Hygiene Personal hygiene remains a key approach to prevention of meningitis. People should endeavour to adopt the following measures:

- ✓ Frequent hand washing with soap and clean water
- ✓ Keeping the environment clean
- ✓ Sleeping in well ventilated rooms
- ✓ Avoidance of overcrowded environments
- ✓ Non-sharing of personal body items with others (towel, handkerchief, brush etc.)
- ✓ Enjoying enough sleep and adequate rest
- ✓ Engaging in regular physical exercise

NB: *It is very important to report to the nearest health facility immediately, if you experience any of the signs or symptoms listed above.*
