



Professor Galadanci Ranks Among the Top TIME 100 Most Influential Figures in Global Health for 2024

The Time International Magazine of New York has released its maiden list of TIME100 Most Influential People in Health of 2024, with Professor Hadiza Shehu Galadanci of Bayero University, Kano making the list.

The Editor-in-Chief of the Magazine, Sam Jacobs, in a letter to the readers while revealing the list said “together, the individuals on the TIME 100 Health list are a reminder that many things are going right and their work is enough to inspire the belief that the world of health is in the middle of a golden age of accomplishment and transformation.”

Mrs. Hadiza, born in Galadanci quarters of Kano city, North Western Nigeria, is a professor of Obstetrics Gynecology and a senior consultant at College of Health Sciences/Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital and currently a Director of the Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP), of Bayero University, Kano, was recognized for her innovation and selfless service dedicated to creating tangible, credible change for a healthier population.

In its May 2024 edition, the magazine revealed that Professor Hadiza Galadanci was specifically acknowledged for her innovation along with 99 others across the world, whose action it said “reflects humanity at its best: people using all their resourcefulness and ingenuity to help one another to live better.”

“Whether you are familiar with the individuals on this list or this is the first time you are reading about them, their work is changing the lives of people in your community and around the world. We are thrilled to announce the first TIME 100 Health,” the report reads in part.

The nominees were categorized under five groups of innovators, Titans, Pioneers, Leaders and Catalysts. To make it into the 100 most influential people in health, Professor Galadanci, was appreciated for her efforts at giving aid for abolishing maternal maternity.

The team noted Hadiza's efforts in which, in the year 2020, for every 100,000 Nigerian women who gave birth, about 1,000 did not survive. According to the World Health Organization (WHO). “Dr. Galadanci, a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Nigeria's Bayero University, knows that problem all too well. Over more than 20 years, she practised as an ob-gyn, she has seen numerous “women dying from conditions when we know what causes them and we know how to treat them.” Often, she wondered, “why is it that we can't address maternal mortality?”

TIME Magazine observes that over the past few years, Galadanci, a clinician, researcher, teacher and mentor, has worked with a network of collaborators in other countries to implement and study a simple yet effective system for preventing fatal *postpartum hemorrhages*, one of the leading causes of maternal mortality.

As part of her ingenuity, first, doctors place a blood-collection drape under a birthing mother, so they can track exactly how much blood she has lost during delivery. (Often, it's difficult for doctors to assess how much blood the mother has lost.) If the blood pooled in the drape passes a certain level, physicians provide a simultaneous “bundle” of treatments—including uterine massage, medications, and intravenous fluids—rather than trying them one at a time, which can take too long. If the suite of interventions doesn't work, they move quickly to the operating room.

A 2023 New England Journal of Medicine study found out that this intervention, compared to standard care, led to a 60% lowered risk of serious complications, including severe blood loss and hemorrhages resulting in surgery or death. Only six months after the study was published, WHO used it as grounds for updating its childbirth guidelines—lightning fast in the bureaucratic world of global health.

It will take a long time to see how the approach affects global maternal-mortality rates, but Galadanci is already seeing change at the local level. “I get to facilities where [they're using this system] and they're telling me they haven't seen any women dying of [postpartum hemorrhage] since they started,” she says. “That's enough satisfaction that it is working.”

Already, Galadanci is working towards solutions for other common causes of maternal mortality, including seizures that occur late in a person's pregnancy or shortly after birth, known as eclampsia.

To prevent or treat eclampsia, doctors sometimes give an at-risk expectant mother multiple injections of magnesium sulfate. Galadanci's team has partnered with WHO to study whether a smaller number of injections proves equally effective, since this approach would be faster, more affordable, and more accessible. She expects data collection to wrap up this spring and if the results are good, the approach could shortly become part of standard medical practice.

Speaking on the Galadanci's hard work, the immediate past Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission (NUC) Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, said he was highly impressed with her commitment, ingenuity and perseverance.

Professor Rasheed, a onetime Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, said Hadiza is an intellectual per excellence

who is very intelligent, brilliant and hard working. “She made us proud as she most eminently represented our University, Kano state and Nigeria in all ramifications. We are all proud to associate ourselves with her.”

Also commenting, the former Deputy Governor of Kano state, Professor Hafiz Abubakar, noted that Nigerians as a whole were very much proud with her performance and innovation in the global arena of medical field.

In his reaction, Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, said members of the University community were elated about her recognition in the global arena, which is a great source of pride to the University and our country as a whole. She also represents the religion.

“This recognition for Professor Galadanci didn't come to me as a surprise as already I envisaged it coming, taking into consideration her efforts in addressing the most critical medical challenges facing our society as well as her unequalled commitment in her professional callings. He said the recognition is for the University, her state and the country as a whole.

The Vice Chancellor described Galadanci as an exceptionally brilliant academic who faces all assignments with zeal and seriousness and she always detests failure.

Others that made the list included a 99 year-old Jimmy Carter, the 39th president of the United States of America for his decades in the fight against Guinea worm and the current President of France, Mr Emmanuel Macron. Other scientists, doctors and researchers recognized on the list include those who focus on health innovation, cancer researchers Thomas Powles, research scientist Jenna Forsyth and a medical practitioner, Bashar Murad who was recognized in the leaders category for giving health care to the suffering Paletinians from the Isra'elis. Bashar Murad is the executive director of Palestine Red Crescent. Also Pfizer Chief Executive was amongst the list.

A special dinner for bringing together of all the recognized people will be hosted on the 13th of May in New York.

BUK Considers Two-Way Pattern of Paying Registration Fees – Says VC

Bayero University, Kano may consider adopting to a two way method of paying registration fees by students, Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has disclosed.

He was speaking when a supervisory team from Pharmacists' Council of Nigeria (PCN), headed by the Registrar, Pharmacist Ibrahim B. Ahmad, paid him a courtesy call in his office on Monday, 22nd April, 2024.

According to the proposed plan, there will be two categories of students paying their registration fees differently with one category paying higher charges and the other paying less.

He added that those paying higher amount will have constant supply of water and electricity, whereas the others paying less will be treated according to the amount they pay. He said this is because the University would not sit up and watch its international recognition sinking.

The team from PCN is currently at the University's Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences to inspect a 6-week acculturation training programme for overseas pharmacy graduates.

The training is aimed at accommodating the overseas trained pharmacy graduates and making them fit for serving in Nigerian environment. Bayero University happens to be one of the two Nigerian Universities given the approval to conduct such training.

The PCN team was taken to the Vice Chancellor by the Dean, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Prof. Ibrahim Adamu Yakasai.

Earlier speaking, the Registrar of the Council, expressed their interest in helping to produce competent pharmacists for the nation.

Prof. Abbas added that the University is ready to partner with the local government council in training its youths on short courses that would develop their skills and any other arrangement that they may benefit from the University in tackling the situation.

On the issue of erecting structure along the University wall, Prof. Abbas said the University management would look into the matter for possible solution.

In their separate remarks, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Academic, Prof. Sani Muhammad Gumel, Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Management Services, Prof. Mahmoud Umar Sani and the Director of Centre for Renewable Energy Sustainability and Transitions (CREST) Prof. Nasir Isa Fagge, advised the Council of the Local Government on empowering their youth with skills acquisition programmes that would develop their knowledge and make them valuable to the society.

The team was further advised on the importance of law enforcement and the forming a strong forum that encompasses important personalities that would greatly help the community in many ways. 'Yakasai Zumunta' in the Kano municipal was cited as an example in that regard.
